The social audit aims to increase the social accountability of health institutions towards the community by providing information regarding its services and facilities and maintaining two way communications. The audit process employed participatory methodologies as focus group discussions, interviews, document reviews and direct observation. The solar lifting project was conducted in the joint investment of NCDC/ICDP, RM and labor contribution from community.

Child Friendly Local Governance (CFLG): Maijogmai Rural Municipality

Nepal has been practicing child friendly local governance since 2007 in collaboration with development partners and non-government organizations. CFLG has been acknowledged as a key contributor on progressing child rights situation at local level. In new state structure with more independent authority of local governments, the relevance of CFLG has been further highlighted.

With changes on political structure of Nepal, CFLG has new opportunities and requirements. The constitution along with Local Governance Act (2074) and Children Act 2075 has defined mandate and authorities of different layers of

government that is relevant to children. In the fiscal year 2074/75 NCDC is working in collaboration with Maijogmai Rural Municipality for the implementation of CFLG. In the initial phase, women groups, school teachers, representatives from INGO/NGOs were oriented on CFLG, its indicators and their roles. CFLG related codes of conduct were devised during the process. Similarly interactions were held with local children clubs and street dramas were performed. Similarly WASH program with special focus on menstrual hygiene were conducted with school students. Girl Students from Secondary level schools received sanitary pads and Secondary Level Schools were supported for the publication of monthly wall magazines.



Weekly Market (haat) at Campel, Kalinchowk

On 18th May Mr. Bin Kumar Thami the chairperson of RM Kalinchowk and Mr. Babulal Thami the chairperson of ward 1 of Kalinchowk RM inaugurated the weekly market place constructed in Campel.
